Future Majority has conducted public opinion research on a wide range of issues to help leaders address the issues voters care about most. Since its founding, Future Majority has surveyed 147,151 voters across the nation. This recommendations memo features data from a May 6-10, 2022 survey of key congressional districts. This memo is in the public domain.

Despite the hand-wringing and negative media barrage, the data shows that Democrats have a shot at winning in November, but they must act with urgency. Below are Future Majority's recommendations to capitalize on this strategic opportunity, backed up by our latest voter research:

URGENT: Democrats must stop whistling through the graveyard and do more to address inflation and the cost of living. President Biden and the White House must implement a 24/7 "whole of government" approach to address inflation and help working families lower their costs of living.

We urge the U.S. Congress to pack their bags and stay in Washington until every measure is possibly taken to alleviate this problem and force the Republicans to oppose or block these bills as many times as necessary to show the American people where the obstruction lies in Washington. Furthermore, a significant earned and paid media strategy must be deployed.

- Currently, Democrats have a 17-point disadvantage on who is delivering on lowering costs and fighting inflation. It is not good enough to get the Republicans on record once on an issue. Put them on record 50 times for being against price gouging at the pump, lowering insulin costs, or fixing supply chain issues. Make it as painful for the Republicans politically as it is for working families to pay the bills. Force as many votes as possible.
- Democrats, where are the midnight huddles with Members of Congress at the White House forcing the press to cover? Weekend votes? Strong contrasting ads from groups who traditionally deploy paid communication? Press conferences at the gas pump showing how GOP voted? Stickers on the pumps? Investigations on the Kushner-Mnuchin money?

Future Majority recommends these tactics to keep and expand the governing majority:

- Frame the Accomplishments: Stop talking big and go hyper local. Talk about specific legislative achievements on a local level and what it means to voters' everyday lives. Voter support for the Democrats' policy agenda soars when voters hear a message more focused on what the bills do rather than their price tag and "Washington, DC-speak" (i.e., a net 27-point increase in support for the American Rescue Plan and a net 55-point increase in support for the Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill among Frontline District voters). Voters need to hear and see how legislation achievements impact them daily in specific ways.
- Frame a Strong Contrast. Democrats must successfully contrast themselves with the votes the Republicans have taken, their radical positions in states driving the courts, and their obstruction in the Senate. Democrats just saying "MAGA or ultra MAGA" will not get the job done. They must contrast by making Rick Scott's plan the GOP plan. The Democrats' message has a whopping +59% advantage (71-12) over the Scott plan, whereas a MAGA contrast is not a clean winner in Frontline Districts as it only maintains 1-point advantage in the Frontline Districts. Democrats



should be cautious of celebrating MAGA wins in Pennsylvania in other states. Recent history (Matt Bevin in Kentucky in 2015, Trump in 2016) shows the candidate perceived to be easier to defeat is not always the case.

- Remind voters that Republicans blocked anti-corruption legislation (HR1/S1), while Democrats passed sweeping reform to strengthen ethics in all branches of government. Voters consistently blame corruption as a top reason their opportunities are limited. Previous Future Majority surveys show up to 92% of voters are concerned about legislative corruption.
- Republicans also voted against key legislation that would help working families lower costs, such as capping the cost of insulin to \$35 and reining in gas price gouging.
- Frame Freedom: Raise the stakes by centering Democracy and Freedom. Tell voters how the Radical Right has lied to the Senate and highjacked our Courts to take away long-protected Freedoms (Roe v. Wade) and make them kitchen table issues. Roe is about individual healthcare. Roe is about the economy. Roe is about individual freedom. So are voting rights, safer communities by cracking down on domestic terrorism and gun violence. And it is time for the leaders of the attempted coup on January 6th to be held accountable. Note: In Frontline Districts, a pro-choice Democrat maintains an 8-point advantage over a pro-life Republican.

Voters Are Done with the Promises of Lowering Costs

Democrats must stop trying to now rationalize that large spending legislation will lower costs to somehow garner support, even though those actions would not be enacted for years. It's time to roll up sleeves and find simple, immediate solutions. Get some wins and build momentum to show Democrats are delivering in a real way for America's families.

- 94% of voters in Frontline Districts say their income is either staying even or falling behind the cost of living. We asked voters "Would you say your income is:"



The cost-of-living issue extends beyond inflation. Future Majority has monitored voter attitudes toward cost of living for over a year, and no voter survey results have shown fewer than 50% of voters voicing that they are falling behind the cost of living.

Not only is this a high salience issue for voters, but Republicans have been out messaging Democrats persistently and currently enjoy higher favorability on the economy, tackling the cost of living and dealing with inflation than Democrats. This, despite Republicans actions and inaction which arguably have made the situation worse. Voters need to understand that Democrats are doing everything they can to lower the cost of living, tackle inflation, and help the economy soar and that Republicans are not.

Freedom: The Key American Value that Democrats Miss

For years, Future Majority has urged Democrats to embrace the idea of freedom, an idea they have abandoned since Johnson's civil rights era, to Goldwater/Reagan concept that "Freedom is the abolition of all regulation." Freedom regularly polls as the number one most cherished value in America. There has never been a better time to take it back, because of January 6th and Republicans' assault on individual freedoms.

FDR was the last presidential Democrat to fully embrace freedom (the four freedoms). He was not exactly an unsuccessful politician. Infrastructure can be phrased as freedom of movement. The China bill can be phrased as lowering our dependence on China and increasing our freedom. The planks of this platform will look different in a bright blue district than in a purple one. Democrats must have the same top-level concepts and second level concepts everywhere, even if they disagree deeply about specific policies which fall under the value concepts. Freedom enables that messaging. Since we are not telling voters what we value, Republicans will (and are), with great success.

Additional observations from the survey:

- Democrats should stop focusing on price tags and focus more on specifics. Voter support for the Democrats' policy agenda soars when voters hear a message about what the bills do rather than their price tag.
 - (Split Sample) 50% of respondents were asked about their support for "Last year, Congress passed the American Rescue Act, a \$1.9 trillion bill to help the United States emerge from the pandemic. Do you support or oppose this legislation?" 51% in Frontline Districts, 55% in Lean-Democrat Districts, and 71% in Progressive Districts support the legislation. However, 50% of respondents were asked about their support for "Last year, Congress passed legislation to provide relief to keep small businesses open and essential workers like nurses, firefighters, and police on the job. Do you support or oppose this legislation?" Support soars to 78% with Frontline District voters, 83% among Lean-Democrat District voters, and 85% among Progressive District voters.
- The same holds true for the Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill. (Split Sample) 50% of respondents were asked about their support for "Congress recently passed a \$1.2 trillion Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. Do you support or oppose this legislation?" 53% of Frontline District voters support, 57% of Lean-Democrat District, and 74% in Progressive Districts. However, when asked support for "Congress recently passed bipartisan legislation which invests in providing clean water to every home in America, repairing roads and bridges, and expanding access to broadband internet," support soars to 84% in Frontline and Lean-Democrat Districts, and 88% in Progressive Districts.



- Generic House elections are tied in the Frontline Districts, Democrats Lead in Others. When asked who voters would support if the November election for the U.S. House of Representatives were held today, the generic Democrat and Republican are tied at 46% in the Frontline Districts, the generic Democrat leads 47%-40% in the Lean-Democrat Districts, and the generic Democrat leads 64%-23% in the Progressive Districts.
 - However, Independent voters remain fickle toward Democrats. In the Frontline Districts, Democrats and Republicans are tied among Independents at 41%. In Lean-Democrat Districts, Republicans have an advantage with independent voters 38% to 33%.
- Framing the Republican agenda as radical works better than framing it as MAGA. As noted above, The Radical Right (-51 in Frontline Districts) contrasts better when compared to MAGA (-16 in Frontline Districts). We also tested support for two versions of the MAGA/Scott-agenda message against the Democrats' agenda message. Voters were asked "If the choice in November comes down to the following, which message would you support?"
 - "A candidate who is For the People and is fighting for a stronger America by investing in infrastructure and families, creating millions of middle-class jobs, cracking down on corruption, and defending democracy and freedom" or "A candidate who stands with MAGA who will get inflation under control by cutting the out-of-control government spending, get people back to work, crack down on violent crime, is against the teaching of Critical Race Theory, defends precious life, and will secure the southern border with Mexico."

Democrats should run against the Scott/GOP agenda while tying it to the MAGA movement. Voters were presented two messages and asked which would earn their support:

- 71% of voters in the Frontline Districts, 73% in Lean-Democrat Districts, and 82% in Progressive Districts support: "A candidate who is For the People and is fighting for a stronger America by investing in infrastructure and families, creating millions of middleclass jobs, cracking down on corruption, and defending democracy and freedom."
- Just 12% of voters in the Frontline Districts, 13% in the Lean-Democrat Districts, and **6%** in the Progressive Districts support: "A candidate who will make every American pay a minimum income tax, sunset federal laws like Social Security and Medicare after 5-years unless Congress reauthorizes them, and who will finish the wall at the border and name it after President Donald Trump."
 - Independent voters soundly reject the Scott/GOP plan: Just 5% of Independents in the Frontline Districts, 10% in the Lean-Democrat Districts, and 6% in the Progressive Districts support the message
- FLAG: Narrow support for student loan debt forgiveness in Frontline Districts. Democrats are demanding student loan debt forgiveness, but elected leaders should proceed with caution. We asked voters whether they support or oppose the Biden Administration forgiving \$10,000 or \$50,000 of student loan debt in a split sample.
 - [50% saw version A] Do you support or oppose the Biden Administration forgiving \$10,000 of student loan debt?
 - Frontline Districts: 51% support, 47% oppose
 - Democrats: 85% support, 13% oppose
 - Independents: 55% support, 45% oppose
 - Republicans: 9% support, 88% oppose
 - Lean-Democrat Districts: 56% support, 41% oppose
 - Democrats: 96% support, 4% oppose
 - Independents: 48% support, 47% oppose
 - Republicans: 14% support, 82% oppose
 - Progressive Districts: 72% support, 26% oppose
 - Democrats: 94% support, 5% oppose
 - Independents: 68% support, 30% oppose
 - Republicans: 16% support, 80% oppose



- [50% saw version B] Do you support or oppose the Biden Administration forgiving \$50,000 of student loan debt?
 - Frontline Districts: 50% support, 48% oppose
 - Democrats: 90% support, 9% oppose
 - Independents: 47% support, 50% oppose
 - Republicans: 14% support, 82% oppose
 - Lean-Democrat Districts: 56% support, 42% oppose
 - Democrats: 93% support, 5% oppose
 - Independents: 49% support, 50% oppose
 - Republicans: 17% support, 81% oppose
 - Progressive Districts: 68% support, 28% oppose

- Independent voters are open to an alternative solution for student loan debt. We asked voters which policy they would support more: "Forgiving \$50,000 of student loan debt per borrower" or "Eliminating future interest payments for all federal student loans."
 - Forgiving up to \$50,000 of student loan debt per borrower
 - Frontline Districts: 44% of Democrats support more, 26% of Independents support more
 - Lean-Democrat Districts: 53% of Democrats support more, 25% of Independents support more
 - Progressive Districts: 51% of Democrats support more, 42% of Independents support more
 - Eliminating future interest payments for all federal student loans
 - Frontline Districts: 40% of Democrats support more, 30% of Independents support more
 - Lean-Democrat Districts: 35% of Democrats support more, 31% of Independents support more
 - Progressive Districts: 39% of Democrats support more, 30% of Independents support more
- While Democrats need to deliver on student loan debt relief, they should proceed with caution on the amount forgiven and who receives debt forgiveness. We asked Democrats and Independents in the Congressional Districts if they agree with the statement: "Working people who chose to avoid taking on student loan debt should not have to bail out adults who borrowed six figures for an Ivy League master's degree. Construction workers, police officers, and small business owners should not have their tax dollars pay off the loans of high-earning doctors and lawyers." The statement was made by Senator Mitch McConnell, previewing the GOP-attack on student loan forgiveness.
 - Frontline Districts: 66% agree, including 52% who strongly agree. 29% disagree.
 - Lean-Democrat Districts: 65% agree, including 47% who strongly agree. 32% disagree.
 - Progressive Districts: 48% agree, 47% disagree.



Voters support reproductive freedom and pro-choice elected leaders. Respondents were asked "If you had to choose between a pro-life Republican and a pro-choice Democrat in the next election, which would you choose?"

Voters support capping insulin costs and holding pharmacy benefit managers accountable. Voters across all district types broadly support the bill Congress is currently debating that would cap the cost of insulin at \$35 per month and hold insurance company's pharmacy benefit managers accountable to lower prescription drug costs.

o Frontline Districts: 88% support, 7% oppose

Lean-Democrat Districts: 89% support, 7% oppose

Progressive Districts: 94% support, 3% oppose

Voters support reinstating the Child Care Tax Credit. A majority of voters across all district types support reinstating the \$300 per month per child boost to the Child Tax Credit that expired last year, which cut the child poverty rate by nearly 50%, lifting 3.5 million kids from poverty.

Frontline Districts: 65% support, 26% oppose

o Lean-Democrat Districts: 72% support, 21% oppose

Progressive Districts: 79% support, 17% oppose

Hispanic Voters:

We have also completed a study of Hispanic voters in Arizona, Pennsylvania, and Nevada. We will report more in a separate memo, however, we want to highlight some key early findings.

- Hispanic voters are incredibly patriotic, and Democrats should recognize and message around their love of country. When asked, do you agree or disagree with the following statement: "The United States is one of the greatest countries on earth, I am very proud to be an American citizen and I have very patriotic feelings about this country."
 - o Arizona: 85% strongly/somewhat agree, 15% strongly/somewhat disagree
 - Nevada: 82% strongly/somewhat agree, 16% strongly/somewhat disagree
 - Pennsylvania: 80% strongly/somewhat agree, 18% strongly/somewhat disagree
- Hispanic voters are also broadly supportive of reproductive freedom.
 - o 62% of Hispanic voters in Arizona, 66% in Nevada, and 66% in Pennsylvania say abortion should be legal.
 - Among voters who say it should be illegal, 63% of Hispanic voters in Arizona, 62% in Nevada, and 64% in Pennsylvania say abortion should still be legal in the case of rape, incest, or to save the mother's life.



- 60% of Hispanic voters in Arizona, 57% in Nevada, and 58% in Pennsylvania disagree with the potential decision of the conservative majority of the United States Supreme Court to overturn Roe v. Wade.
- The For the People message resonates with Hispanic voters far more than the Make America Great Again message. For example, in Arizona, 67% of Hispanic voters say they would choose a candidate who is For the People and delivered on building a stronger America versus 28% who say they would choose a candidate who will Make America Great Again by getting inflation under control by cutting out of control government spending.

In 2018, Democrats were on the same page advocating the For the People agenda and won. In 2022, the same opportunity presents itself. This effort needs to go from the White House to the state house to be successful.

Future Majority strongly recommends Democrats focus on Framing their Accomplishments, Framing a Strong Contrast, and Framing Freedom – while addressing what voters care most about: kitchen table issues.

We hope these recommendations are helpful in that process.

Methodology:

Since its founding, Future Majority has surveyed 147,151 voters across America. We have surveyed voters in battleground states and congressional districts, rural, urban, and suburban areas, and conducted deeplistening research in Florida, Nevada, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Texas, and across rural America in Wisconsin, Minnesota, and Iowa.

The data presented are from a May 6-10, 2022 survey of 2,663 likely voters in three sets of congressional districts with a margin of error of +/- 2.3%. Districts include: Frontline Districts CA-22, CA-40, IA-03, MI-07, MN-02, NE-02, NM-02, PA-01, PA-07; Lean-Democrat Districts CA-27, MI-03, MN-03, NJ-03, NV-01, NV-04, NY-11, NY-22, OH-01, VA-07; and Progressive Districts: AZ-03, CA-17, CA-37, IL-02, KY-03, MA-07, MN-05, NY-16, OH-03, TX-28, WA-07.
